NOTICE: The City Council may recess from the open session and convene in a closed executive session if the discussion of any of the listed agenda items concerns one or more of the following matters:

(2) The purchase, exchange, lease or value of real property, if the deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the position of the City in negotiations with a third person. Sec. 551.072, TEX. GOV'T CODE.

- risk management information, contracts, and strategies, including fuel hedging and storage;
- plans, studies, proposals, and analyses for system improvements, additions, or sales, other than transmission and distribution system improvements inside the service area for which the public power utility is the sole certificated retail provider; and
- customer billing, contract, and usage information, electric power pricing information, system load characteristics, and electric power marketing analyses and strategies. Sec. 551.086; TEX. GOV'T CODE; Sec. 552.133, TEX. GOV'T CODE]

NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (NIMS) POINT OF CONTACT

ISSUE

Council is requested to consider appointing Ben Williamson, Senior Emergency Management Specialist in the Office of Emergency Management, as the point of contact for the National Incident Management System (NIMS) implementation/maintenance for the City of Garland. Due to the previous point of contact, Don Hart, transferring from the Office of Emergency Management to the Health Department, the appointment of a new point of contact is required.

OPTIONS

1. Appoint Ben Williamson as the City of Garland's NIMS point of contact.
2. Take no action.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Staff recommends Option 1: Appoint Ben Williamson as the City of Garland's NIMS point of contact. If Council concurs, this item will be scheduled for formal consideration at the September 17, 2013 Regular Meeting.

COUNCIL GOAL

Safe, Family-Friendly Neighborhoods

BACKGROUND

The National Incident Management System was introduced in 2004 by the federal government as a method to coordinate emergency response across response agencies and jurisdictions. The NIMS has annual implementation requirements which are reported to the Federal Emergency Management Agency. One of these requirements is for jurisdictions to appoint a NIMS point of contact who is responsible for coordinating NIMS implementation and reporting within the jurisdiction.

On July 19, 2005, Council adopted Resolution No. 9331 formally recognizing the National Incident Management System concept of incident and disaster management. Homeland Security requires a National Response Plan and National Incident Management System in order to remain eligible for future federal preparedness assistance in the form of grants, contracts, and other future receipt of federal funding. The Office of Emergency Management is responsible for managing the NIMS compliance program.

CONSIDERATION

If no action is taken, the City of Garland would fail to meet a NIMS implementation requirement and thus put receipt of Department of Homeland Security grant funds in jeopardy.

Policy Report

TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (TxDOT) SELECTIVE TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM (STEP) COMPREHENSIVE GRANT

ISSUE

Council is requested to consider accepting a Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) – Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) – Comprehensive Grant.

OPTIONS

1. Accept TxDOT STEP Grant Funding.
2. Do Not Accept TxDOT STEP Grant Funding.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends Option 1: Accept TxDOT Grant Funding for the Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) Comprehensive Grant for FY 2013-2014. This item is scheduled for formal consideration at the September 3, 2013 Regular Meeting.

COUNCIL GOAL

Safe, Family-Friendly Neighborhoods – By accepting the STEP Grant, the City Council will augment the ability of the Garland Police Department to provide an even greater level of traffic safety for the citizenry of the City of Garland by potentially changing the driving habits of those who violate the laws related to the four enforcement modules within the grant.

BACKGROUND

The Garland Police Department has successfully participated in STEP enforcement grants for many years. The purpose of this grant is to save lives, reduce motor vehicle crashes and injuries, and change behavior related to driving habits. This is accomplished by aggressively enforcing the laws of the State of Texas related to red light and intersection violations, seat belt violations, speed violations and driving while intoxicated violations.

The enforcement activities will also be supplemented by additional public information and education campaigns conducted throughout the enforcement period. These efforts will be focused throughout the City of Garland.

CONSIDERATION

The grant for the FY 2013-2014 is in the amount of \$457,362.09. If accepted, TxDOT will reimburse the City of Garland \$249,583.89. The grant requires the City to provide \$207,778.20 in matching funds. This will be accomplished in part through fringe benefits expenditures, TMRS contributions, vehicle mileage costs, and administrative time spent on grant related paperwork. Consequently, the City can satisfy the contractual match requirements without expending any additional funds.

CHANGE ORDER NUMBER 1 TO BL 05289 ASBESTOS ABATEMENT

ISSUE

Council is requested to consider authorizing Change Order No. 1 to BL 05289 in the amount of \$60,245.30 (a 63% increase) with Intercon Environmental for unforeseen failed expansion joint damages and turbine re-insulation which resulted in an increased insulation need.

OPTIONS

- (1) Approve a resolution authorizing the City Manager, or his representative, to execute Change Order #1 with Intercon Environmental and allocate the additional funds necessary for the additional insulation needs.
- (2) Take no action.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends Option (1) - Authorize the City Manager, or his representative, to execute Change Order Number 1 totaling \$60,245.30 with Intercon Environmental. If Council concurs, this item will be scheduled for formal consideration at the September 17, 2013 Regular Meeting.

COUNCIL GOAL

Consistent Delivery of Reliable City Services

BACKGROUND

The original Blanket Order for this work was thought to have one optional renewal left, when it was discovered that it did not, the services were rebid but awarded to a different vendor. This resulted in a need for a change order to the contract amount for the original vendor since the repairs and re-insulation had already been performed.

CONSIDERATION

It is recommended that a resolution authorizing the City Manager, or his representative, execute Change Order Number 1 to BL 05289 in the amount of \$60,245.30 (a 23% increase) to provide for the additional insulation requirements. The BL 05289 original amount of \$95,000.00 will be increased to \$155,245.30.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 32, "NEIGHBORHOOD SANITATION AND HOUSING SERVICES", OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS; PROVIDING A PENALTY UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SEC. 10.05 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE AND A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS:

Section 1

That Sec. 32.81 of Chapter 32, "Neighborhood Sanitation and Housing Services" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas is hereby amended by inserting, in appropriate alphabetic order, the following additional definitions:

"Junked trailer. A trailer that is wrecked, dismantled, partially dismantled or inoperable.

Trailer. A vehicle without motive power that is designed, adapted or used to carry property or passengers on its own structure exclusively."

Section 2

That Sec. 32.81 of Chapter 32, "Neighborhood Sanitation and Housing Services" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas is hereby amended by amending the definition of "violating vehicle" to read as follows:

"Violating vehicle. Includes a junked vehicle, junked all-terrain vehicle, junked boat, junked trailer or junked off-road motorcycle or part thereof that is in violation of this division."

Section 3

That Sec. 32.82(B) of Chapter 32, "Neighborhood Sanitation and Housing Services" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(B) A person commits an offense if the person causes, suffers, allows or permits the parking or standing of a motor vehicle or a trailer in a residential zone within ordinary public view on private property owned or controlled by that person if the vehicle:

- (1) Has one or more flat tires;
- (2) Is missing one or more wheels; or
- (3) Is supported by one or more jacks, jack stands, blocks or similar means."

Section 4

That a violation of any provision of this Ordinance shall be a misdemeanor punishable in accordance with Sec. 10.05 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas.

Section 5

That Chapter 32, "Neighborhood Sanitation and Housing Services", of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, as amended, shall be and remain in full force and effect save and except as amended by this Ordinance.

Section 6

That the terms and provisions of this Ordinance are severable and are governed by Sec. 10.06 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas.

Section 7

That this Ordinance shall be and become effective immediately upon and after its passage and approval.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 33, "TRANSPORTATION" AND CHAPTER 24, MUNICIPAL COURT AND ADMINISTRATIVE ADJUDICATION OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS; PROVIDING A PENALTY UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SEC. 10.05 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE AND A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS:

Section 1

That Chapter 33, "Transportation" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, is hereby amended by adding a new section, Sec. 33.53, to read as follows:

"Sec. 33.53. Maximum allowed parking distance from curb face

A vehicle is unlawfully parked if the vehicle is parked in a manner such that any portion of the vehicle extends more than 102 inches from the face of the immediately adjacent curb, if the street has a curb, or edge of pavement, if the street does not have a curb."

Section 2

That Sec. 24.44 of Chapter 24, "Municipal Court and Administrative Adjudication" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, is hereby amended by adding a new subsection (E) to read as follows:

"(E) If no specific penalty amount is provided in 24.44(A), the general civil penalty for a parking violation enforced under the provisions of this chapter shall be \$75.00."

Section 3

That a violation of any provision of this Ordinance shall be a misdemeanor punishable in accordance with Sec. 10.05 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas.
