

## Organization Capacity

Capacity includes the knowledge, skills, relationships, leadership, and resources present within a neighborhood. When more capacity exists, communities are better able to mobilize and support specific change efforts. The programs and services offered through the Office of Neighborhood Vitality are designed to increase organizational capacity in keeping with our philosophy that collective action provides the most effective means of developing and sustaining vital neighborhoods. The chart below provides an overview of organization capacity needs and the consequences when one of the elements is missing.
