



On June 18, 2019, the City Council approved the newest Water Conservation and Water Resource Emergency Response Plans. The plans reflect best management practices widely adopted throughout North Texas as part of a regional water conservation initiative. Year-round, water users are encouraged to limit seasonal lawn watering. The numbered stages summarize watering restrictions if (or when) our water supply is affected by drought, equipment failure, etc. Detailed information on all reduction strategies can be found at [GarlandWater.com](http://GarlandWater.com)

### Water Conservation Plan



**April - October** outdoor watering is allowed twice per week (no watering from 10am - 6pm).  
**November - March** outdoor watering is allowed once per week (no time-of-day restrictions). Customers are free to select which day(s) of the week they would like to water. *Watering with hand-held hose, soaker hose or drip irrigation is allowed at any time, on any day, as long as excessive runoff does not occur.*

### Water Resource Emergency Plan



**April - October** outdoor watering is allowed twice per week, on Tuesdays and Saturdays only. (no watering from 10 am - 6 pm).  
**November - March** outdoor watering is limited to one day per week; customer selects day. (no time-of-day restrictions).

The planting of cool season grass is discouraged. *Watering with hand-held hose, soaker hose or drip irrigation is allowed at any time on any day as long as excessive runoff does not occur*



**April - October** outdoor watering is allowed one day per week (**your trash pickup day**).  
**November - March** outdoor watering is allowed once every two weeks (**your recycling pick up day**). *To determine your trash/recycling schedule, visit [garlandews.com](http://garlandews.com). (Non-residential customers can determine authorized watering days by the posted residential schedules for their business location).*

The planting of cool season grass is discouraged. *Watering with hand-held hose, soaker hose or drip irrigation is allowed at any time on any day as long as excessive runoff does not occur.*



**All outdoor water use is prohibited.**

Use of water to wash any type of vehicle is prohibited (includes boats, RVs, motorcycles, airplanes, etc). Permitting of private pools is prohibited. Foundations/trees/landscape may be watered only with hand-held hose, bucket, soaker hose or drip irrigation up to two hours a day as long as excessive runoff does not occur.

Stage 3 is considered an extreme water supply emergency and will require the cooperation of all water users.
